### **September is National Preparedness Month**

Richland, Wash.: September is National Preparedness Month, and Benton County Emergency Services (BCES) and the Benton Franklin Chapter of the American Red Cross are teaming up to help local citizens become better prepared for disasters that could strike our area.

"It is essential that families are prepared for disasters that could affect our area, including fires, earthquakes, floods, windstorms, and potential hazardous material spills," said Bob Spencer, manager of Benton County Emergency Management. "Families should have an emergency supply kit and a family emergency plan, along with being informed about the different threats that may affect them."

BCES and/or the Red Cross will be involved in a number of September events to help residents become better prepared, including:

- Kennewick General Hospital's Kid's Health & Swellness Event at Columbia Center Mall on Saturday, September 6;
- Benton City Daze in Benton City on Saturday, September 6;
- An open house for area residents at the offices of Benton County Emergency Services in Richland on Saturday, September 20, and;
